Dear Parents and Community members,

One of our school goals this year is to develop the leadership capabilities of the children. A benefit of being a small school is that we can offer the children, especially within the senior class, numerous opportunities to demonstrate leadership, opportunities that may be limited at a bigger school with a wider pool of students. Last week the senior class travelled in to the new EA networks centre to participate in a physical activity leadership course hosted by Sport Canterbury. The aim of this course was to develop confidence and leadership ability in the children to become better leaders. The challenge now for the senior children is to organise activities for the younger children at playtime and lunchtime. On the last day of term we plan to have a house day where children can dress in their house colours and the senior children will organise house games. We invite parents to come along and join in with these activities before we have a shortened sharing assembly.

Next Friday, we have the Science Alive team returning to our school. They came last year and the children thoroughly enjoyed the hands on science activities. We do require some parent helpers next Friday to assist in the classroom, so please contact the office if you can help out. To cover the cost of travel and the science materials, we are asking that parents pay a small fee. The cost for each class will be: Room 1 and Room 2-\$6, Room 4 and 5- \$7.50. Please can the money be sent up to the office before next Friday. Room 1 and 2's topic will be Renewable energy lego while Room 4 and 5's topic will be Electrifying Energy.

Early next term we plan to have parent interviews again. The date for these will be Thursday 30th July. School will again finish at 12:30pm with the interviews starting at 1pm. At the interviews you will be presented with a mid year report. It will also be an opportunity to discuss the goals that were set in Term 1 and determine new goals for the rest of 2015.

On Monday 22nd May the Board of Trustees met. At the meeting the following items were discussed:

-Principal and Finance Reports were tabled.

- A report on Special Needs Education at Mayfield School was presented.

- A plan to upgrade the library was discussed with the board.

- Permission for school to finish early on Thursday 30th July for parent interviews was granted.

- The Board is in the process of applying for charity money for the purpose of upgrading the school courts.

- A Home and School report was tabled.

- Curriculum Planning, Reporting and Self Review policies were reviewed.

- Mark Greenslade was co-opted onto the board as a board member.

- Board members attended a Community of Schools meeting at Mt Hutt College.

This meeting was to inform board members about the possibility of some schools within Mid Canterbury joining together to form a community of schools. Our school has expressed an interest in being involved but has yet to make a firm commitment. The benefits of joining this community would be increased collaboration between teachers and principals on teaching and learning practices.

Senior Class Meeting

On Wednesday 1st July at 3pm we are planning on holding a meeting about the Senior class for 2016. This meeting is for parents that have children currently in Room 1 and for parents of Year 5 children whose children will be in the Senior class next year.

Winter Sports.

Early in Term 3 (August 6^{th)} is the Winter Sports Tournament for children Years 5-8. For this tournament we combine with Mt Somers Springburn and Carew Peel Forest Schools. The sports for the Winter Sports Tournament are Rugby, Soccer, Netball and Hockey. Practises for this will begin on Thursday 18th June at the Mayfield Domain. The Milo is to be served from the shelter shed at the netball court. Please tick each child off the list as they have their drink. Obviously ensure each child has had their Milo before giving 'seconds'.

Please wash up in the staffroom and feel free to have a tea/coffee with the teachers if you would like.
