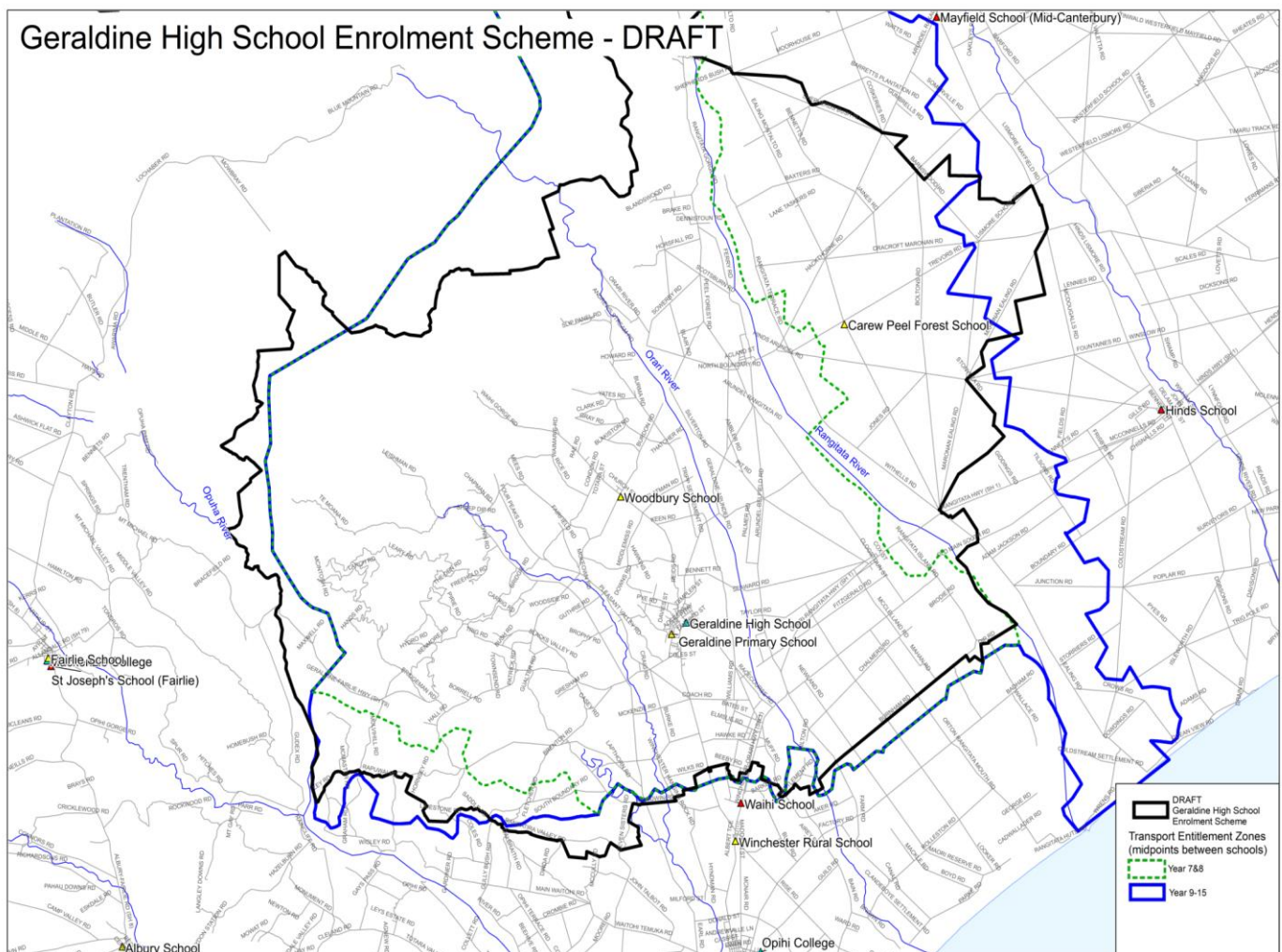
BoT Snippets

On Monday the board held its March meeting. At the meeting the following matters were discussed:

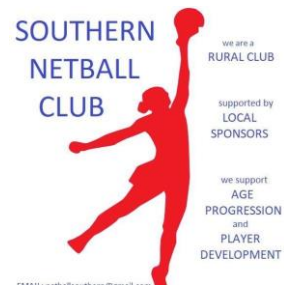
- Principals report was tabled- This report outlines the school's progress towards its annual aims

They have been forced to do this by the Ministry of Education who believe that Geraldine High School (GHS) is in danger of overcrowding. The new enrolment zone will cut out parts of the Mayfield district and consequently restrict choice for some parents in regard to high school options. These are held in Term 2, every Wednesday from 3.30 - 4.15pm at the Hinds School Netball Courts.

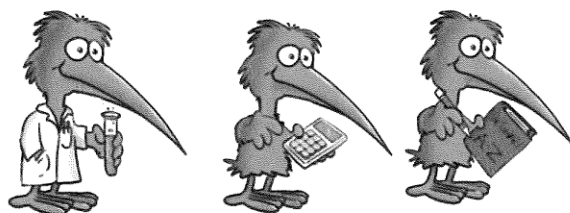


