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

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VFACTS New Car Sales January 2016

The Australian new car market made an impressive start to 2016 with 84,373 sales last month which is 2.7 per-cent up on January 2015.

Toyota again took front-running with total January sales of 12,453 units – 24 per-cent ahead of second-placed Mazda. The Japanese giant says its strongest start to SUV sales in three years was a prime driver of its success – 4,341 SUV sales this year compared to 3,740 in January last year. That number includes 1,094 Prados and 1,089 LandCruisers.

However it was the Mazda3 which was Australia's number one best-seller in January with sales of 3,722 vehicles — that's almost 1,000 up on second-best Toyota Corolla (2,758). In fact it was a record start to the year for Mazda with 10,016 sales — beating the previous best January result of 9,411 sales in 2014. The compact Mazda2 joined its larger stablemate (Mazda3) in topping its market segment as Mazda powered to a market share of 11.2 per-cent — its best result ever.

Hyundai ranked third with January sales of 7,001 vehicles – exactly 100 ahead of its tally in January last year.

Holden finished fourth, GM's January total of 6,824 vehicles was down on the 6,901 recorded 12 months ago and translates into a small market share of just 8.1 per-cent.

Nissan sales were up, the Japanese importer finishing the month in fifth position with sales of 5,563 vehicles – more than 1,000 more than January last year.

And, compared to last year, Kia has booted Honda from its top 10 ranking. The Korean company sold 3,116 vehicles in January and sits just 289 vehicles behind ninth-placed Subaru. Some are predicting Kia will solidify that ranking and finish the 2016 sales race in the top 10.

Ford Chief's Compensation Raised to \$17.4 Million By REUTERSMARCH 18, 2016

The salary, bonus and stock awards given to Ford's chief executive, Mark Fields, jumped 17 percent to \$17.4 million in 2015, a year in which the automaker earned a record pretax profit, the company said on Friday. Including pension and perks, Mr. Fields made \$18.6 million, which was actually a decline from \$18.9 million in 2014. It was the first full year under the guidance of Mr. Fields, 55, and the company earned a record pretax profit of \$10.8 billion. Last month, Fiat Chrysler said that the total compensation for its chief, Sergio Marchionne, was \$73.6 million — but that includes the value of stock awards that Mr. Marchionne has not collected, and their value fluctuates over time. General Motors has not filed documents yet related to the pay package for its chief, Mary Barra.

When do you need to Repair/replace transmission?



Gone are those days when diagnosing transmission issues were time consuming, potentially expensive and rather inexact science. Nowadays, you can check it without spending your valuable time. Thinking how? Keep reading.

Let's start with an example, if your stomach begins to hurt without warning, what will you do? You'll probably think of the last item you ate in order to figure out why you're having the pain. When it comes to getting the most out of a transmission and avoiding unnecessary costs, regular transmission maintenance is a must. Regular maintenance keep transmission cool and well lubricated, which are the vital keys to long transmission life.

Ford's upcoming performance powerhouse is poised to embarrass six-figure sports coupes when it debuts down under in winter 2016.

In news that will do little to mollify muscle car diehards, the 2.3-litre turbocharged four-pot fitted to the new Focus RS will be more powerful than Audi's supercharged S5, and is even within spitting distance of Holden's 6.0-litre V8.

Ford's new EcoBoost four-pot drums out an obscene 257kW from just 2.3 litres, aided by a vast turbocharger that's good for about 1.6 bar (23.2 PSI) of boost.

The Focus RS is stacking up as the performance bargain of the coming year
The EcoBoost unit also promises to be hugely muscular across the rev range, offering 440Nm from
1600 to 5000rpm, as well as a short-term 'overboost' function, which offers 470Nm for 15-second
stabs at the horizon.

Outputs like these are sure to pit Ford's plucky RS against unexpected rivals, such as the \$80,000, all-wheel-drive hyper hatches from Mercedes and Audi.

At a mere \$50,990, the Focus RS is stacking up as the performance bargain of the coming year.

Ford has pitched its new RS a little further downmarket than AMGs and RS Audis, singling out the Golf R and WRX STI in particular.

With 257kW and 440Nm, the Focus RS has a 51kW and 60Nm lead over the 206kw/380Nm Golf R, but still manages to undercut it on price by a full \$1000.

Oct 20 2015, Jack Pyefinch Cars Guide



Grieving Ford fans will soon have a reason to get over the loss of the locally-made Falcon. The iconic Ford Mustang muscle car will return to Australia after almost almost 50 years. It will replace the Falcon as Ford's performance hero in 2016, the same year the Falcon is axed.

Ford's global vice president of sales and marketing, Jim Farley, will fly to Australia to personally deliver the good news on August 13. Farley is the same Detroit executive who spent the past three years deflecting media questions about the future of Ford's Australian manufacturing operations.

The normally secretive Ford is taking the unusual step of making the announcement early because it is trying to reassure Australians it will continue to sell cars here even though it will close its manufacturing operations after 90 years.

Australia will not get the Mustang currently onsale in North America but an all-new model that's been designed for global sales. It is due to be unveiled at next year's New York motor show, the 50th anniversary of the Mustang. Some countries will get a fourcylinder version of the new Mustang but Ford Australia is understood to only be taking the V8 performance models.

The last time a Ford Mustang was imported to Australia as a right-hand-drive car was in the late 1960s. Ford Australia converted a small number of Mustangs locally between 2001 and 2003. They were rushed in to compete with the modern Holden Monaro, but priced close to \$90,000 fewer than 400 were sold.

EXCLUSIVE Ford Mustang to replace Falcon in 2016?

Ford won't make the same mistake this time around; the new Mustang is expected to have a starting price close to \$50,000. In North America the basic V6 Mustang costs less than \$30,000. Ford Australia would not confirm the announcement but confidential sources have confirmed to Carsguide: "Mustang is a goer".

The new generation Mustang has already been confirmed for the UK -- likely to be the largest market for right-hand-drive models, with Australia next in line. Because right-hand-drive versions of the Mustang are expected to account for less than 10 per cent of global sales Ford Detroit is keen to sell it in as many countries as possible to recover the extra engineering costs involved in making a right-hand-drive model.

The Mustang will spearhead Ford Australia's revived line-up at a time when it will likely be receiving gloomy publicity over its factory closures. When announcing the closure of the Broadmeadows car assembly line and Geelong engine factory, Ford Australia boss Bob Graziano said the company would increase its model range by 30 per cent with more imported cars.

The arrival of the Ford Mustang may persuade organisers of the V8 Supercars racing series to modify the rules to allow two-door coupes to compete. Currently only sedan vehicles are eligible to race in Australia's premiere motorsport championship. Racing legend Dick Johnson raced a Mustang in the 1985 and 1986 Australian touring car championships when Ford temporarily dropped the Falcon V8.

The Ford Mustang is one of the world's most iconic cars. When it was unveiled at the New York motor show in April 1964 Ford expected to sell 100,000 Mustangs in its first full year on sale. It went on to sell more than 1 million in just 18 months. It took Chevrolet 40 years to reach the same milestone with the Corvette.

Now I am left wondering who is doing my engineering. I am sure someone will be doing them, surely. Nice of them to let me know!

As far as any plans getting to the Certifiers so I can make a start, as I had expected back in December, not a skerrick of a chance. Looking like it will be a build start in winter but I just can't figure out which winter.

The Shed Outbuilding

The <u>Promised</u> roller doors for the first shed have not turned up yet but soon I hope. They Promised.

The second shed has its roller door up and it even works. Got power to the second shed so I can start setting it up. I have treated the floor with an epoxy coating and it is tricky stuff to use.

Paint verses epoxy- Paint is easy to apply and dry's according to the day's temperature but is long enough that you can do the whole floor in one go. Epoxy is about the same to apply but it is an A-B mix and dries by chemical reaction. If it is warm and allows solvents to evaporate quickly you need to be fast or have a crew helping. I had to do the floor in 6 different goes.

Paint, although it is good, will suffer under turning tyres whereas epoxy is as tough as the concrete itself. Paint can be compromised by oil and the likes as it always remains a little porous where epoxy once cured (7 days) is resistant to all fuels, oils and even its own solvents.

Now all I need to do is justify buying a hoist. Maybe if I tell Mrs Gullible it will help her do the gardening are something. Or maybe I can say it will automatically wash her car. I need help with this one! What could you advise me on to justify a hoist?

IMPORTANT F.O.C.C. C.H.V.R.S. INFORMATION

In order for F.O.C.C. members to maintain their C.H.V.R.S. status within the club, they <u>must</u> conform to the following requirements:-

- (a) Pay their club membership fee(s) **by** 31st December of each financial year.
- (b) Produce a statutory declaration form, completed in full and in a legible manner, with any unused lines "zedded" off. N.B. New club members, who have a vehicle(s) on the C.H.V.R.S., are not required to produce a statutory declaration for the first year of club registration and multiple vehicles can be put on the one statutory declaration form.
- (c) Produce the vehicle(s) **<u>current</u>** registration certificate(s).
- (d) Produce the "Certificate of Exemption" form for any L.H.D. vehicles.
- (e) Have your log book, for each vehicle, available for signing by an Authorised Officer.
- (f) Before a <u>new</u> replacement log book can be issued, produce the <u>old</u> log book for cancellation.
- (g) Ensure that a vehicle inspection is conducted, at least once every three (3) years, by an Authorised Officer.
- (h) Any alterations required to a members current log book, **must only** be addressed by an Authorised Officer.

Any member, who does not wish to conform to the above, will have their C.H.V.R.S. status removed from the club registry.

MODERN CLASSIC -

Manufactured from 1st January, 1965 to 31st December, 1978.
