Every year our school sets targets for the year and lets the Ministry of Education know what they are and how we expect to meet them.

Our Targets for this year are to have 85% of our students achieving at or above the National Standards in reading and 80% of students to be achieving at or above the National Standards in Mathematics by the end of 2016.

Below are graphs showing the progress our students are making towards meeting our schoolwide targets this year. I have included progress results for writing even though writing is not a schoolwide target as some of our teachers have students on individual writing programmes which have been accelerating their progress.

End of Term 2, 2016 Writing Mid Year Progress Results

This is a progress result for writing at the end of term 2 as the students work towards the end of year National Standard. Overall we have 56% of our students at or above the standard at this stage of the year, 31% progressing towards the end of the year standard and only 13% below.

The 13% of students below are all targeted students which have extra programmes in place to assist with their learning.

We have 64% of Maori achieving at or above the National Standard for writing with still the remainder of the year until they have to have met the standard and 30% progressing towards meeting the standard by the end of the year.

Only 6% of Maori are below and these students have a special reading programme in place to assist with their learning.

End of Term 2, 2016 Reading Mid Year Progress Results

Whole School	14%	18%	30%	38%	100%

This is a progress result for reading at the end of term 2 as the students work towards the end of year National Standard. Overall we have 68% of our students at or above the standard at this stage of the year, 18% progressing towards the end of the year standard and only 14% below.

The 14% of students below are all targeted students which have extra programmes in place to assist with their learning.



We have 64% of Maori achieving at or above the national standard for reading with still the remainder of the year until they have to have met the standard and 32% pro-

gressing towards meeting the standard by the end of the year. Only 4% of Maori are below and these students have a special reading programme in place to assist with their learning.

Mid Year Progress Results

This is a progress result for Mathematics at the end of term 2 as the students work towards the end of year National Standard. Overall we have 55% of our students at or above the standard at this stage of the year, 35% progressing towards the end of the year standard and only 10% below.

The 10% of students below are all targeted students which have extra programmes in place to assist with their learning.

We have 58% of Maori achieving at or above the National Standard for mathematics with still the remainder of the year until they have to have met the standard and 42% progressing towards meeting the standard by the end of the year.
