Hi Everyone,

Our curriculum focus area for this term is Social Studies and we are learning about Pepeha (who we are and where we are from). This will culminate in a Grandparents Day near the end of the term where students can share what they have learnt about themselves and their families. Over the past couple of weeks all classes have been working on the Keeping Ourselves Safe programme run with the support of the Police Education Officer. at risk; know how to keep safe when meeting and mixing with other people; recognising different forms of abuse; and having strategies for taking action regarding abuse. We have had some excellent discussions in the senior room and Constable Miller was very impressed with how maturely and readily the students responded to the issues being discussed.

Our Physical Education focus for this term is Aquatics with an emphasis on confidence in the water, water safety, and mastery of basic swimming strokes. The more senior students are preparing to compete in the Cluster Swimming Sports on Tuesday 1 March, followed by the Super 6 Swimming Sports on Friday 18 March. We'd love your support at these events. Next week we have Surf Life Savers visiting our school to deliver two lessons per class on Surf Safety. Thanks to the great weather and Ross' vigilance with pool maintenance the children have really been enjoying their lessons this year, and what great progress many of them have made.

We are fortunate to have the support of outside agencies such as Sport Whanganui who enable us to offer the best learning opportunities for our students. Students in Room 1 will develop foundation skills through playing games and interactive activities. Years 2 and 3 have just begun Fundamental Movement Skills with the purpose being to build on the foundation skills needed to play games, sport and recreational activities.

In Term 3, Years 4, 5, and 6 will participate in the

Basic Sports Skills programme which is the transition stage from fundamental movement skills to practising and mastering basic skills needed to participate in sport.

The Senior class is very excited to begin their sensational 'Shine or Sail' programmes which start this Friday. Approximately half the class will be spending their Friday afternoons out on Pauri Lake learning the finer points of sailing Optimists under the very capable guidance of Shaun Thomas, Sheryl Ryland, and Anna Jones. How fortunate we are to have such dedicated people to share their expertise. The other half of the class are participating in the ShineGIRL programme run by ShineGIRL Whanganui.

This is an 8 week self-development course which aims to encourage girls to value and believe in themselves, to make good decisions, and to dream big for their futures. This finishes with a celebration event at the completion of the course.

Because we are running these programmes each Friday afternoon, school assemblies will now be held on <u>Thursday afternoons on a fortnightly basis</u>, beginning next week. Therefore **NO ASSEMBLY THIS WEEK.**
