TARGETS/RESULTS

Every year our school sets targets for the year and lets the Ministry of Education know what they are and how we expect to meet them.

Our targets for 2017 are to have all students (8) currently Well Below the National Standards at the end of 2016 to have made at least a year's progress in writing by the end of 2017.

We are also targeting the (14) year 4-8 'Below' cohort and especially focusing on writing for boys as 11 of the 14 are boys. Therefore our aim will be to have the 'Below' cohort meeting the National Standards in writing by the end of 2017.

Our other target area is Mathematics where we will be aiming to have All students (8) currently Well Below the National Standards at the end of 2016 to have made at least a years progress in Mathematics by the end of 2017.

We will also be targeting the year 4-5 and 7-8 'Below' cohorts as these students make up 15 of the 17 students below the National Standards and therefore our aim will be to have both cohorts meeting the National Standards by the end of 2017.

Overall we had 73.5% of our students At or Above the National Standards at the end of 2016. We had 79% of Maori students achieving at or above the National Standards.
