**Welcome** - I wish to welcome three new children and their families to Kai Iwi School. Our new students are Aeryn (Rm2) and Rowan (Rm3) Drakefield and Lyzz Barry (Rm4). We hope your school days at Kai Iwi are very rewarding and lots of fun.

**Parent/Teacher Interviews** - A note went out yesterday advising you all of our parent/teacher interviews. This is an opportunity for parents to sit down and discuss their child's progress with the teacher.

It is important as a parent and for your child for you to know how your child is progressing and where their strengths and weaknesses are, that's why twice a year we send out a National Standards written report and just after the mid year report we give you the opportunity to come and discuss the report with the classroom teacher.

**ICT** - At the end of last term the school purchased 20 new Chrome books and a computer charging trolley capable of charging 30 Chrome books at a time. This trolley is also lockable which gives some security to our new purchase.

I also applied for a grant with Powerco Wanganui Trust and I am pleased to announce they have approved my application and will allow us to purchase some more Chrome books to add to our twenty.

We have already had some professional development in regards to the many programmes and uses a Chrome book possesses and this will be on going. The boys class trialled the new devices yesterday, signing in using their new personal passwords for the first time.

When we are further along and using the new educational apps which are available across the curriculum, we will be inviting parents in to see how the students are engaging and how their learning has been enhanced through the use of up to date programmes which can run on these new devices.

**Property** - Over the holidays I had a contractor come in and paint the netball and tennis courts as the lines had faded over the years and were nearly non-existent. *It now looks great!* The cost of the painting will be paid for from the money raised from the local pig hunt which took place last term, so thanks very much to Carrissa (Board Member) and the parents who helped on the day, you have all contributed to our nice new painted courts.

**Sport** - The Super Six year 7-8 programme is underway again with the Racquet sports day tournament on Thursday the 18<sup>th</sup> of August.

We are currently practicing Badminton, Squash and Tennis every Tuesday after technology.
