PRINCIPAL'S COMMENT

Kia ora Koutou, Hi Everyone

I hope everyone enjoyed their long weekend. A lot of people travelled away for the first time in a long time. It looks like we may be going to Alert Level 1 next week so sport and a bit more normality may resume.

<u>Cellphones</u> - Many schools these days have banned cell phones. I don't want to go down that track but if students do not keep to our school policy, which I have included below, we may have to.

We do not recommend that students bring cellphones to school. Cellphones are not necessary to have during the day. However, we understand that some parents like their children to have a phone to communicate with them after school.

If a student does bring a phone to school, the following guidelines apply:-

- The school does not accept responsibility for lost, damaged, or stolen phones.
- Students must turn their phones off in class and keep them out of sight.
- If a staff member observes a student with a cellphone during class time, the student must hand it to the staff member immediately when asked. The phone will be kept in the office and can be collected by the student at the end of the day.
- If cellphones are used for a learning activity, this will be at the teacher's discretion and the phone's use will be supervised by a staff member.
- Students may take a cellphone on EOTC activities. These guidelines and other relevant school policies will apply.
- If a parent needs to contact their child urgently during the day, they should call the office.

Inappropriate Cellphone use:-

If a student is observed using a phone inappropriately, it will be confiscated and a parent must pick up the phone from the office. If possible, students should lock their phone before handing it to staff. Inappropriate use of a cellphone may include:-

- Any sort of bullying, e.g. disrespectful messages about staff or other students.
- Taking photos or videos of other people without their permission.
- Forwarding inappropriate messages or content.

We may be changing our policy to read all children must hand in their cellphone on arrival to school and collect it after school, unless a prior arrangement has been made with the classroom teacher. (To be discussed at next BOT meeting)

<u>Uniform</u> - Please remember to make sure your child is in correct uniform. Coloured hoodies and cut-off jeans are not part of our uniform. Footwear is to be worn at all times when outdoors.

<u>**Teacher Aide Position**</u> - Thank you to everyone who applied for the teacher aide position. We had such a great response and some really good applicants. We have now appointed Michaela Carr to work in room 1. Michaela is a trained early childhood teacher and is a mother to Jacob who has just had his 5th birthday yesterday.
