Mandarin every Friday with a student teacher from Wanganui High School. She will also be teaching students about the history, customs and everyday life in China, enabling students to learn first-hand about another culture and make comparisons with their own.

In Term 1, we spent time with Sarah from Horizons learning about the factors that contribute to making our waterways unhealthy. We had an interesting in-class lesson using an interactive model township which enabled students to simulate everyday activities which affect the groundwater and ultimately our rivers, lakes and seas. We then had a day at the beach where we investigated the health of the Kai Iwi Stream, and studied the creatures that live in it. Through this study we learnt that one of the ways to help improve the health of waterways and the creatures within them is to carry out Riparian planting along their banks. This Wednesday, the senior students will be working along the stream on the McDougal's property putting in hundreds of plants as part of our on-going environmental work in our area.

A very dedicated team of senior class mums and a grandma are providing Friday lunches which are proving to be very popular. This is part of their fundraising for senior school camp at Vertical Horizons, and will carry on until the end of term 2. You will have seen our 'Hoedown' advertised in the newsletter and on Facebook. This is our big fundraiser for camp so we are hoping you will support us by coming along and having a great night out on June 22nd. 


VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO HELPWITH FOKIS FUNDRAISER!!


PAST PUPIL NEWS
