Under the Health and Safety at Work
Act 1974 and the Electricity at Work
Regulations 1989, all employers have
legal obligations to ensure that electrical
installations and equipment are safe.
Part P (electrical safety) of the Building
Regulations was introduced on 1st
January 2005 so that similar obligations
for safe installations extended to private
dwellings.

ECA Registered Members are skilled in delivering the design, installation, testing & commissioning (including maintenance) of all types of electrical installations* from lighting and power installations to high voltage, industrial controls, data

communications, telecoms and fire and security systems.

Regulations are constantly being reviewed, for example April 2006 saw the introduction of the amended Part L of the Building Regulations that increases the energy efficiency standards for all buildings. The ECA ensures that Registered Members are kept up to date with such regulatory changes, provides training where necessary, and ensures that ECA Registered Members are compliant with the regulations for the sectors in which they operate and checks that the certification issued meets current standards.

The Electrotechnical Certification Scheme (ECS) card* is administered by the Joint Industry Board (JIB) and affiliated to the Construction Skills Certification Scheme

(CSCS). It is the sole ID and competence

card scheme for electrotechnical operatives in the UK. ECS cards enable operatives to confirm their identity, competence and qualification levels.

Subject to its terms and conditions, the ECA Guarantee of Work Scheme gives clients of ECA Registered Members assurance that electrical installation work failing to comply with relevant Standards will be rectified. The ECA Guarantee is only effective for claims notified within six years of completion of the work and is subject to a maximum limit of £50,000, or £100,000 for the same client in any one year.

Where it is available and subject to its terms and conditions, the ECA Bond indemnifies the clients of ECA Registered Members for the additional cost of completion if the member fails to complete electrical installation work to the relevant Standards or because the member has become insolvent. The insurers liability under the Bond is limited to a maximum of £100,000 (or as shown on the ECA member's Bond Certificate, whichever is the lower).

The ECA Bond is underwritten by The Electrical Contractors' Insurance Company Ltd and is valid only when a Bond Certificate is signed by both the ECA Registered Member and the party with whom the member is in contract.

Every ECA Registered Member agrees to abide by the ECA Code of Fair Trading, which is registered with the Office of Fair Trading.

The Code covers a member's working practices, the standard of workmanship and materials, tendering and payment procedures. It also outlines best communications practice, sets out an agreed complaints procedure and provides a framework for arbitration.

The Code is designed to be fair to both client and contractor, making each aware of their particular obligations and thus minimising the possibility of contractual disputes.
