### Meals on Wheels






Meet David K., one of the newest members to receive nutritious meals free of charge. David is mentally frail, handicapped, and lives alone without family support. Unfortunately, David recently fell while home alone. It took him time to reach the phone and await being taken to the hospital.

Currently he is recovering at home. At this time, he cannot properly take care of himself. Upon receiving the request from his social worker, we immediately added him to the program to insure that his need of nutritious meals for the week and Shabbat is met.

We need your help to assist David in an additional important way. Due to his fall, he can't go out alone. We are looking for a caring and dedicated volunteer to escort him on his local trips in the Ramot area. (bank, post office, etc.)

Originally from America, D.S. was living and working at a university in Israel. The need to take care of her ill parents in the United States caused her to temporarily relocate. Upon her return to Israel, she herself became ill, wheelchair bound, unable to work in her profession and reliant on oxygen support equipment. Her doctors prescribed a special and strict diet.

David thoroughly enjoyed eating what he called "our delicious lunch" while he would "schmooze with my friends."

We were thrilled to see how the activities at the Center filled his life until the very last day of his life...

We will always remember David Kastner, z"l, as a gentle man with a beautiful smile who lit up our lives! The family asked Rabbi Badichi to give the *Hesped* at David's funeral which the men of our Kollel attended, as well as the shiva, to be menachem avel with the family and share their loss.

David lived with his son and his family for several years before coming to Ezrat Avot. After his passing, his daughter-in-law called us to thank us and tell us what it meant for him and their whole family to be a part of our Senior Men's Kollel.



I don't have enough words of appreciation for all that you gave us and my father- in-law. He was living with us for several years, depressed, doing nothing but staring out the window. And of course this mood affected all of the family terribly. As soon as the Kollel opened he was one of the first members to join and his entire life immediately changed from darkness to light.





He woke up happily every

morning and said right away 'I want to go to Ezrat Avot now'! And he always came home with a big smile and told us 'I have my life back' and would regale us with his stories of the day."

She continued, "I am not exaggerating when I say that I believe that because of Ezrat Avot he lived another two and a half years!"
