1. It was made of sandstone.



2. The lighthouse was painted red and white in 1853 to make it more recognizable during the day.



3. Dexter Stetson was the foreman.

4. The Cape Hatteras Lighthouse has a black and white striped daymark pattern.



5. Cape Hatteras Lighthouse is the tallest brick lighthouse in the United States.

6. In 1999 the Cape Hatteras Lighthouse was moved.

7. In 1980 the first foundation (1803) of the Cape Hatteras Lighthouse washed away in a severe storm.

8. The Principal Keepers' Quarters, Double Keepers' Quarters, oil house and cisterns were moved before the Cape Hatteras Lighthouse was moved.

9. The Diamond Shoals are where the Gulf Stream meets the Labrador Current

10. It took 23 days to move the Cape Hatteras Lighthouse.
