Sign-Up Instructions

On Monday, June 6, Afternoon Option Sign-Ups will be live on your Lead Contact Dashboard. Login at <https://cenational.org/momentum/register/lc> to access your Lead Contact Dashboard.

The only day you MUST sign your group up for something is Saturday's outreach options. Wednesday – Friday you can elect to sign up your students for either on campus activities or off campus outreach options although you don't have to sign up for either on those days. There are "open play" options available. If you sign your students up for any on campus options, they cannot also participate in an off campus outreach option on the same day and vice versa.

If you wish to split your group up, i.e. some stay on campus and some go off campus, you must maintain your 12 to 1 ratio of students to adult leaders in either option.

For off campus outreach options you are responsible to transport your own group, however, if you would like to use transportation provided by Momentum, you MUST select an option under the highlighted areas below which Momentum will be transporting people to. If you choose to use Momentum's transportation means, you will be charged a \$4 per person fee at check in for any outreach options Wednesday – Friday AND Saturday.

The following pages outline the options that will be provided each day. We suggest looking through them before sign-ups are live on Monday to plan out your students' week and to identify a first and second choice as all sign-ups are on a first come, first served basis.

Should you sign up for any option and then find that your number needs to be adjusted per cancellations or additions to your group, contact us at momentum@cenational.org.

For groups selecting to go on any of the Wednesday/Thursday/Friday afternoon community outreach/service projects, you will be provided a boxed lunch as you board your transportation. These are at no extra cost UNLESS your group is a no-show or cancels after June 30 (or your group numbers are dramatically lower) - at which time a \$7/person charge will be added to your group's credit card held on file for incidentals.

If you select an On Mission Community Blitz option, you will be given more information as we near conference from our On Mission team pertaining to the street location you'll be ministering to. There will be an informational meeting on Friday at Momentum for leaders electing the Community Blitz option for Saturday.

Cyborgs

Capacity: 40 per half hour

1:30 - 2:00, 2:00 – 2:30, 2:30 – 3:00, 3:00 – 3:30, 3:30 – 4:00, 4:00 – 4:30, 4:30 – 5:00, 5:00 – 5:30

Cyborgs is played in a building on the Cedarville Campus. Of the 40 players, 30 are “survivors” and 10 are “cyborgs.” Once the survivors are released into the dorm, the cyborgs attempt to find the survivors and hit them with a foam finger rocket to tag them. Hit survivors return to the “span point.” Will the cyborgs be able to find and hit all 30 survivors within the 30 minutes? Sign up one slot per individual.

Indoor Volleyball

Co-ed volleyball-Teams must have both genders represented. Rotating is required and no more than six people on the court at one time. Rally scoring and games are played to 15 win by 2 or whoever gets to 21 first. Capacity: 12

Spikeball requires teams of two. Gentlemen serves will be required. It is open to all students. Scoring will be rally scoring with games being played to 21 win by 2. Pockets are played. First come, first served - spots remaining after online sign-ups will be available to sign up for at the Your Day Your Way Table. Sign up one slot per team (not per individual)

Momentum’s Got Talent

Students are encouraged to practice their skills such as vocal solos, teen challenges, creative writing, musical instruments, piano solos, and much more. Even art pieces can be brought to Momentum and entered. Students enter MGT by creating and uploading a video of themselves performing whatever they are planning to present or registering online that they are bringing a piece of artwork.

One of the great advantages of a student’s involvement in Momentum’s Got Talent is the opportunity to be eligible for scholarships. Several colleges give renewable scholarships to winners and often to students who are part of the audition round at Momentum.

In addition, several Momentum's Got Talent entries will be selected to present their talent in Momentum's main sessions. Students may end up singing (for example) in front of 2,000+ people!
