
About this Report

What did the instructor do that most helped your learning?

Comments

Very detailed video lectures, very knowledgeable in topic.

I loved the structure of this class. Having the asynchronous lectures coupled with field trips and discussions during the class period was really effective for me. Peter is a wonderful instructor—his enthusiasm for the subject created an environment in which learning was fun. I learned a lot in this class. It has been my favorite class in the MURP program.

Explaining about real-life cases

Explained in detail how projects really get done. Organized field trips for each class period where we got to talk with professionals intimately involved in what we were studying.

Peter is excellent at moving between the practical and the philosophical in a way that is not found in the other classes I have taken at the Humphrey School. They focus on "research" and application, with significantly less understanding of the latter. Research, though, requires a large mess of data to generate insight, and is easily bounded by the limitations of experimentation. Peter's use of the philosophical to contrast his extensive practical knowledge provides a more wide ranging and engaging look into the city. Not bounded by the day–to–day limits of boring studies, the class is able to engage with the city wholly, up front, and in person. The issues confronted are reflected through the real experience of the people who make Minneapolis what it is. Furthermore, in doing so, the class is not limited to just being about one area. It is not a real estate class, nor a design class, it is a class more honestly about cities than any I've yet to take. Other faculty, especially those in the unengaging and dull transportation concentration, could learn from this approach.

Peter is, to put it simply, a fantastic instructor. He is always prepared, interested in everything, and very flexible and supportive of students and their needs/interests. Unlike some Humphrey professors (unfortunately), he is very creative in how he conceives of and structures his classes, or at least this one! The combination of asynchronous video lectures and regular readings, combined with in–class site visits, time with practitioners, and in–class discussions of the readings/videos and our papers, adds up to a wonderful (and thoughtfully–designed) course. We have had literally every class as a "site visit," and have had the opportunity to spend tons of time outdoors/indoors out in Minneapolis, seeing public realm sites in real life. I appreciated, truly, that Peter was flexible (gave me an extension when I needed it) and was very open to feedback about course materials, plans, etc. 10/10, well–done!

The field trips, guest speakers, facilitated discussions, and feedback on assignments were all great.
