The Outer Banks Lighthouse Society is a non-profit organization that aids in the preservation of the lighthouses of North Carolina and works with the National Park Service and other agencies, both government and non-profit groups, to achieve the safe keeping of the buildings, artifacts and records of the U.S. Lighthouse Establishment, aka Lighthouse Board, Bureau of Lighthouses and U.S. Lighthouse Service. Students are encouraged to learn about lighthouses and to appreciate their beauty and significance.

Each year the Outer Banks Lighthouse Society with a total student grant fund of \$4,000 will sponsor as many awards as possible for assisting student groups with expenses related to visiting a North Carolina lighthouse. The maximum allowed for any one grant is \$1,000.

The applying *schools* or *recognized youth groups* (ex. Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, and 4-H) will submit the following information by **January 31**. All awards will be considered by the Grants Committee of The Outer Banks Lighthouse Society, and applicants will be notified by the end of February.

6. Have you ever received any funding from the OBLHS? If so, please give details about all funds, when they were granted, and how they were spent.

Reports in a folder must be submitted within six months of the grant notification. Once the reports are approved, funds will be dispersed. If all materials are in order, the process is a brief one. All materials submitted become the property of The Outer Banks Lighthouse Society and will be stored in The Outer Banks History Center after they have been examined by The Board members.

6. Detailed proof of expenditures with official receipts for expenses
